Bangadarshan was a Bengali literary magazine founded by Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay in 1872 and revived in 1901 under the editorship of Rabindranath Tagore. It played a significant role in shaping modern Bengali literature, cultural identity, and nationalist thought. The magazine aimed to bridge the gap between educated elites and the wider public by promoting writing in Bengali. It serialized many of Bankim's major novels, including Vishabriksha, Krishnakanter Will, and Anandamath, the latter featuring the patriotic song Vande Mataram.
